

CANVEE LIFE SCHOOL STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

General Requirements

- You meet the basic admission criteria for the program (High school graduate and fluent in English).
- You are choosing to enroll in the Program on your own free will, not being forced by parents, teachers or other third parties.
- You are capable of managing your own personal basic needs, including medication.
- Before starting the program, you will disclose any physical limitations or health concerns that could impact your ability to fully participate in activities while at Canvee Life School.
- You commit to following the schedule and activities that the Canvee Team has prepared for you.
- You are responsible for obtaining travel insurance and providing the information to the team prior to arrival.

Emotional and Mental Health Requirements

- You are able to participate in classes and group meetings and actively listen to the program staff, professors and other students.
- You are able to share your thoughts, feelings and needs to the program staff.
- You can manage the stress that may occur with international travel and following schedules.

The Life Changing Year is not a therapeutic program, and participants who are adjudicated, court-mandated or requiring regular in-field therapy are beyond our expertise to monitor and will not be permitted to join our program. You are required to share with us any mental health diagnosis during the admission process.

Behavior expectations

Not following behavior expectations can lead to a dismissal from the program at the student's cost (no refunds)

- No drugs allowed. This includes the purchase, possession or consumption of drugs.
- Although responsible drinking is allowed outside class time, drinking deemed excessive or becoming drunk and belligerent is not tolerated at Canvee Life School.
- No sexual assault or sexual misconduct of any kind.
- No risky or harmful behaviors, including breaking laws and activities such as sky diving, bungee jumping and any other activity that might be considered dangerous. If students discover activities they would like to do during the stay at the program, they must consult the staff. We'll do our research ensuring the activity is safe.
- Treating yourself and other students with respect.
- There will be zero tolerance for bullying behaviors – we work towards creating a positive and safe environment for our students, delivering a fun and positive experience.
- Discriminatory or racist behaviors are not allowed. At Canvee Life School we embrace diversity in all its forms, and we love and respect participants regardless of their age, race, religion, gender identity, sexual orientation, background or nationality.
- You will be respectful to the staff, professors and classmates, as well as to the local people.
- Actively participating in the activities included in the Program.
- Attendance to class and meetings is mandatory, unless previously justified and approved excuse.

Master in Personal Development & Self-Leadership Requirements

Attendance & Class Behavior

- No eating or alcoholic drinking is allowed during class.
- Daily attendance and participation are expected.
- You must arrive on time for class.
- Cell phones are to be turned off, text messaging is prohibited, and laptops are to be used solely for taking notes.
- Unexcused absences for the class are not allowed.

Late submission policy

- All assignments are expected to be submitted in time. Points will be deducted from the total points possible for late assignment submissions

Academic integrity

Canvee Life School expects students to understand and maintain high standards of academic integrity. The following are examples of prohibited activities:

- Plagiarism (theft of someone else's ideas and work, including the incorporation of facts, ideas, or specific language taken from another source, and not properly cited)
- Inappropriate Collaboration (including the use of professional or expert editing or writing services, as well as statistical, coding, or other outside assistance). Collaboration on assignments is prohibited unless explicitly permitted by the instructor.
- Cheating (copying other students' work or exams)
- Duplicate Assignments. Prior written permission of all instructors is required if students wish to submit the same or similar work in more than one course.
- Research, Fabrication, and Falsification. Students are expected to be honest and accurate in all work submitted
